

This topic will build upon children's previous learning about the United Kingdom, its capital cities and the surrounding seas. Children will be introduced to vocabulary such as city, village and town and will begin to be able to discuss the advantages and disadvantages of living in these locations. Children will develop their skills in using maps and Google Earth to locate towns, cities, villages and places of interest whilst beginning to use the vocabulary of North, South, East and West to explain their position in relation to another location. Children will be given the opportunity to draw upon their maths skills to create simple graphs and pictograms to represent data relating to populations of Derby and London.


